






Filter Removal and Replacement Procedure

Tools required: none

Before you begin, read and understand all steps of the procedure before beginning so as to familiarize yourself with what is required. Use common sense and always work safe.

1	<p>Turn electrical power off to your spa by turning off its GFCI breaker.</p> <p>Note: It is recommended that you lock this GFCI breaker box so that no one can accidentally turn the power back on while you are working.</p>	
2	<p>Open the filter cover and set the cover in a safe place.</p>	
3	<p>Grasp the top of the filter with both hands and unscrew each filter one at a time by turning them counter-clockwise until they are all removed. Place the old filters in the trash.</p> <p>Note: Filters can sometimes be cleaned and re-used, depending upon their age and condition. You can clean filters with a spray of clean water from a garden hose carefully separating each filter pleat and flushing all debris away. To make sure that your spa filters properly, always replace them at the recommended replacement intervals.</p>	
4	<p>Screw each new filter one at a time by turning them clockwise until they are all replaced. Properly tightened filters are screwed in until they just stop (snug but not tight).</p> <p>Tip: You may need to use one hand to locate the hole and the other to guide the filter.</p>	

5	Replace the cover to the filter area.	
6	Turn power back on to the spa by turning on the GFCI breaker.
